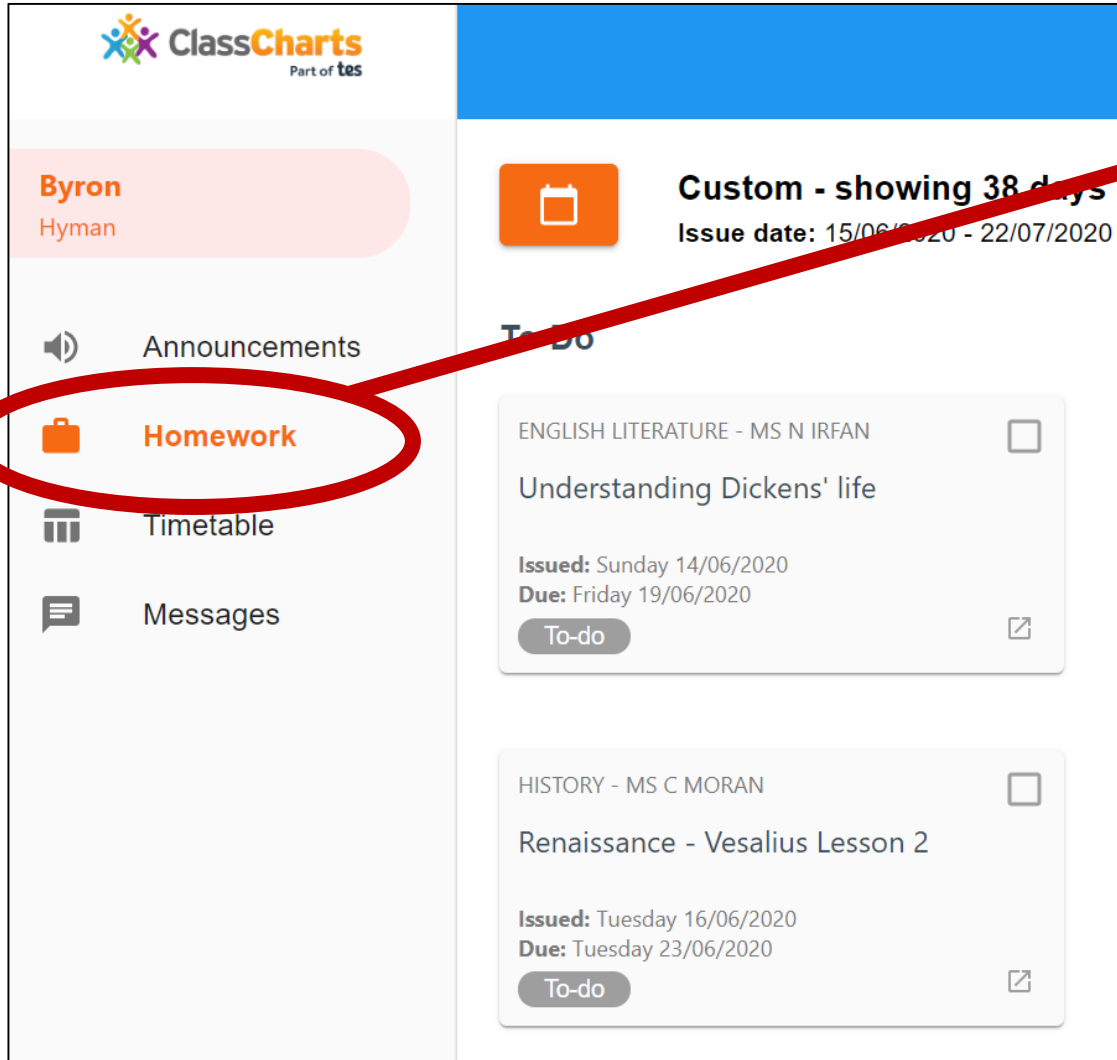

How to view your homework




On your ClassCharts dashboard, click on the homework tab, and you will see your 'To-Do' list of homework tasks.

For example, you can see there are two pieces of homework here, English and History.

At the bottom of the main homework dashboard, you can also see any completed, late and missed homework.

ACTIVITY FOUR: Charles Dickens
Read the information and complete the tasks
Dickens and Poverty
Dickens experienced prison and poverty in his own childhood. In 1824, London, John Dickens was locked in Marshalsea debtor's prison for failing to pay his debts. His son, Charles, aged 11, was sent away to a blacking factory, covering and labelling pots of shoe polish in appalling conditions as well as loneliness and despair. He lived separated from his family, as his younger sister and mother were put in prison with his father. Later, he wrote in a letter with horror: 'No words can describe the secret agony of my soul as I sank into this companionship.... The sense I had of being utterly neglected and hopeless, fired with grief and humiliation, my lonely vulnerability, my hungry misery, and the knowledge they had willingly put me in this situation. I could not bear to think of myself beyond reach of any honourable success.' After three years he was returned to school, but the experience was never forgotten. Dickens lived just nine doors down from the workhouse until 1831, when he was 19 years old.

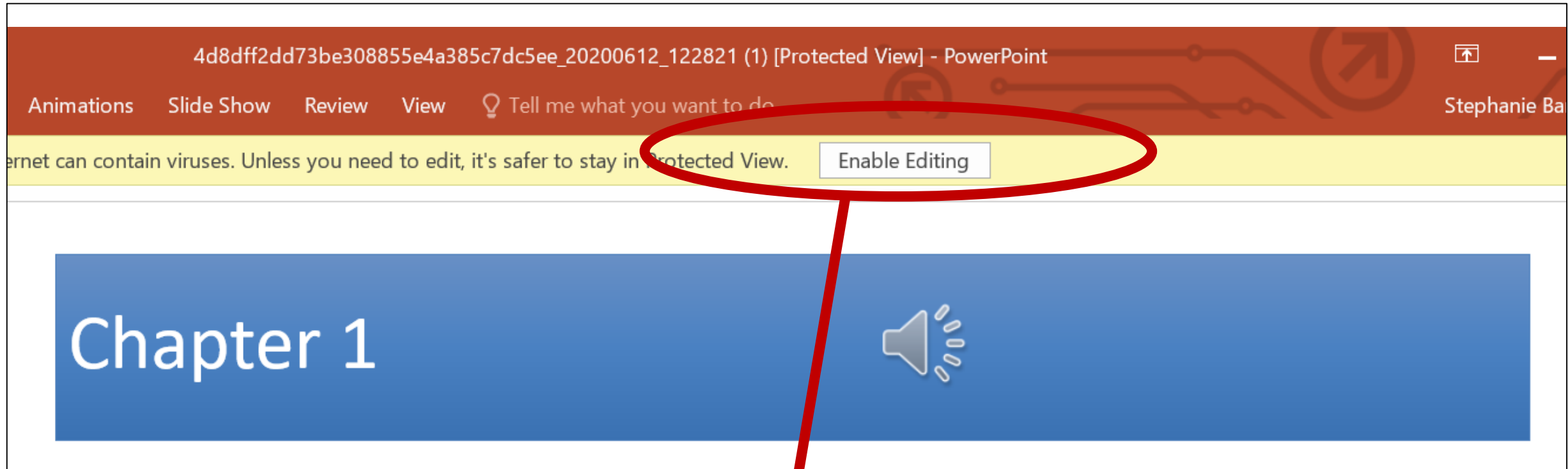

Clicking on this will give you the option to play the audio.

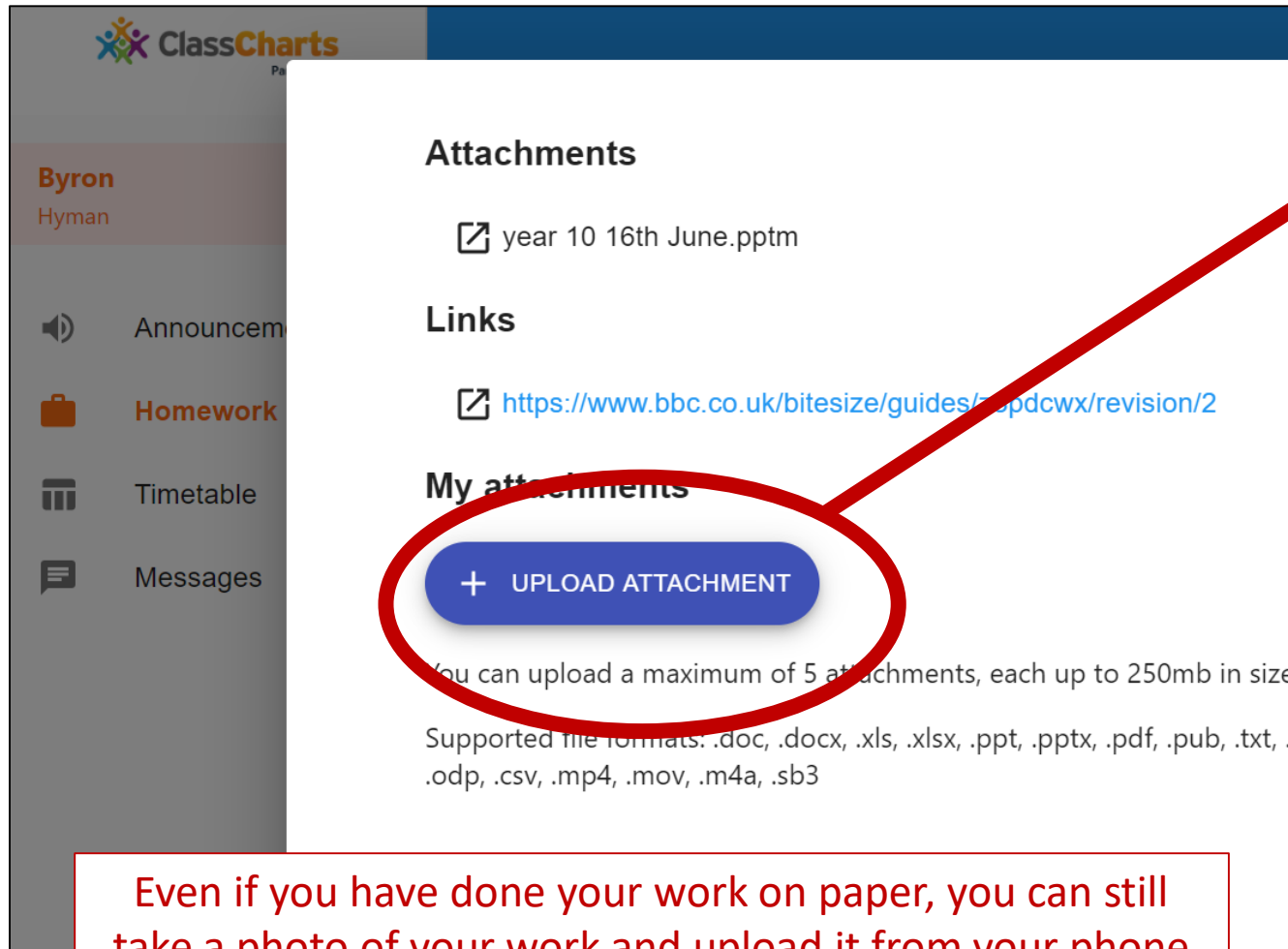
You must listen to your audio instructions before completing any task set.

To upload your work:

There is a blue button which says 'UPLOAD ATTACHMENT'.


Click this and select your homework file. It can be found wherever you have saved it onto your computer, tablet or phone.

ClassCharts will allow you to upload many types of file, including:

- Word documents
- PowerPoints
- Photographs
- Images
- Videos
- Audio files

Even if you have done your work on paper, you can still take a photo of your work and upload it from your phone to send to your teacher for feedback.


Once uploaded, you should be able to see your file name above the upload button.



Viewing feedback from your teacher



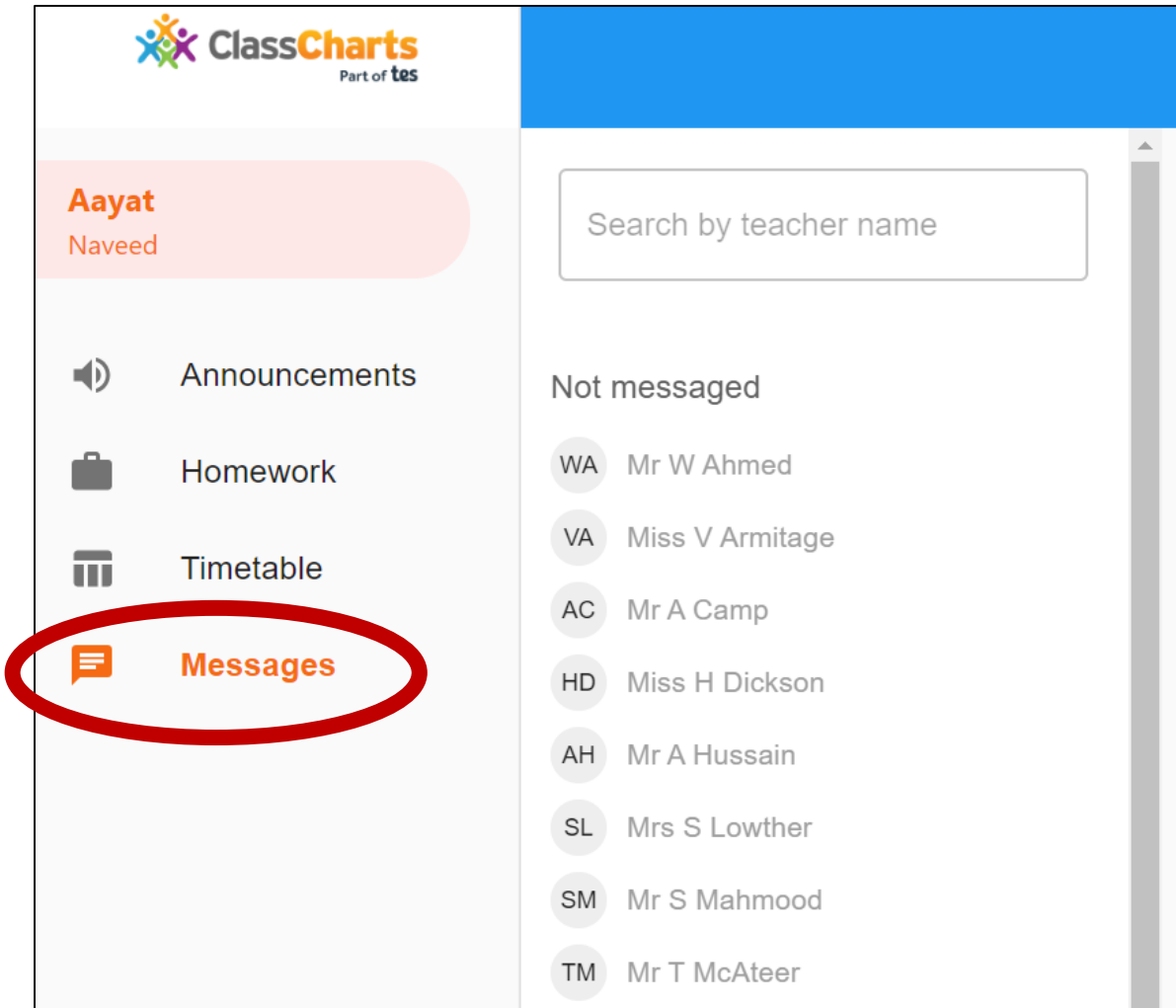
Click on the task to open it.

You can find your feedback under the uploaded file. It appears as a 'teacher note'.

What do we mean by 'feedback'?

- Sometimes you will receive individual written feedback for completed work.
- Please note that in some cases your teacher will check the entire classes work and then choose to provide whole class feedback as part of the next task.
- This may mean that you do not receive individual written feedback, but the next lesson will address any misconceptions.
- Multiple-choice quizzes / low stake tests may provide instant feedback on incorrect options once you have completed the quiz, this too counts as feed

How to view your homework



If you need to ask your teacher a question about a piece of homework, you can send them an email or you can do this via ClassCharts messaging.

- Click on the Messages tab at the bottom.
- Select the teacher you want to message and type your question.
- Remember to be polite and ask appropriate questions.

Your teacher will get back to you as soon as possible, so please be patient.

ClassCharts – tips!

- If you are using ClassCharts on a Smart Phone, you can download the Microsoft Word and PowerPoint apps for free from the app store. If you login using your school email address, you will be able to open any Word / PPT attachments on your phone.
- If you do not have access to Microsoft Office products (Word, PPT etc) you can use your school Microsoft 365 account to use these products for free at home. If you are unsure how to do this, please see the guide which is available on the website.
