Some of our highlights:

- Very positive Ofsted judgements for those of our schools that have been inspected since joining the Trust. Two are now outstanding schools, others have progressed to being good, whilst others still requiring improvement are clearly improving at pace.

 - > At the age of five, 72% of our children achieved a • In terms of results this year: 'good level of development', up from 68% in 2016. This says a great deal about what our schools are doing in nursery and reception years. These children are well placed to do well at primary school.
 - > By the age of eleven, 50% of our children achieved the expected standard in reading, writing and maths compared to only 34% in 2016. This prepares them well for secondary school.

> By the age of sixteen, 55% of our young people achieved a GCSE at Level 4 or above in both English and Maths compared to 48% in 2016.

- > At eighteen the average A level grade in our schools was a C grade. Our newly established Trust 6th Form based at Beckfoot, Beckfoot Oakbank and Beckfoot Thornton will raise standards further.
- We have established annual or bi-annual Trust-wide events linked to sports, arts and debating.
 - > Well done Beckfoot Allerton for winning the Trust Debating competition this year. They were amazing. All of our schools are developing more and more learning opportunities for children to talk about ideas. Talk matters!
 - > We love the Sports and Arts. Last year we had our first ever Trust Arts Festival where children from all our schools showed their talents in dance, drama, art and music. It was great.

- > Sports Day was fantastic with Year 6 and Year 7 children from all of our schools competing. Winners included children from all our schools. It was a particular joy to see children from our special schools competing against others from our mainstream schools and winning! Overall Beckfoot Priestthorpe and Beckfoot schools took the
- We really believe in empowering our pupils. We want them to have a view about the world they live in. We held our first ever Trust-wide student conference in February 2019 which was brilliant. Student leaders challenged us to make sure our schools are fit for children growing up in the 21st century. The world is rapidly changing, the pressures on young people are more complex and of course the world of work is very different. We need to make sure our schools move with the times, keep our children safe, develop them as people, make sure they have ambition and prepare them for a great future.

We live out every minute of our school day through our Trust motto; Enjoy, Learn and Succeed.

Our young people **enjoy** school through the experiential opportunities we provide including:

- There were in excess of 40 trips and visits in the last academic year.
 - Year 11 were so business like in the 'revision conference' we put on at a nearby hotel where teachers of English, mathematics and science delivered sessions that allowed our young people to learn in a completely different way.
 - All our Year 9 (now Year 10) students were involved with the charity First Give who seek to work with schools to empower

young people to become more engaged in community related initiatives. A tutor group from our school were selected to represent Yorkshire in First Give's national event. This included a tour of the Houses of Parliament.

Our young people **learn** in school through the academic, motivational and leadership opportunities we provide, including:

- Excellent motivational speakers including Kajal Odedra, the executive director for Change.Org UK division and Jon Hammond the BBC Radio and Television presenter.
 - Students have really benefitted from these experiences and are developing their leadership skills through our student leadership body and Social Action Group.

Students are really thriving in their positions of responsibility as they help shape the future direction the school travels in.

Our young people **succeed** in school as seen in our Year 11 results:

- In the summer of 2018, the progress our students made from coming in to our school to leaving at the end of Year 11 allowed us to win a national award. This has enabled us to hold up our older students as role models for our
