

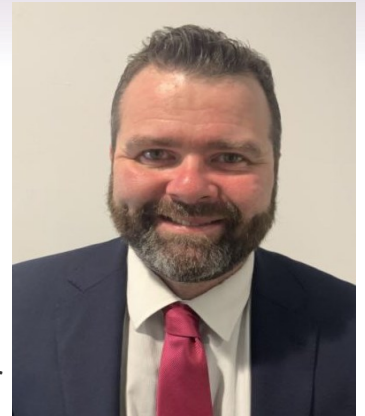
WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING IN SCHOOL?

Restart a Heart Day

Students from all year groups participated in Restart a Heart Day today. We were delighted to welcome Vicky Reynolds, Deputy Lord Lieutenant who came to see our students receive this life-saving training.

The Resuscitation Council UK along with the British Heart Foundation, British Red Cross, St John Ambulance, the Association of Ambulance Chief Executives, NHS England, Save a Life for Scotland, Save a Life Cymru, and Northern Ireland Ambulance work together to help raise awareness of cardiac arrest and teach CPR.

In 2018, an amazing 291,000 people were trained in CPR through Restart a Heart Day, and now our students have joined this number.



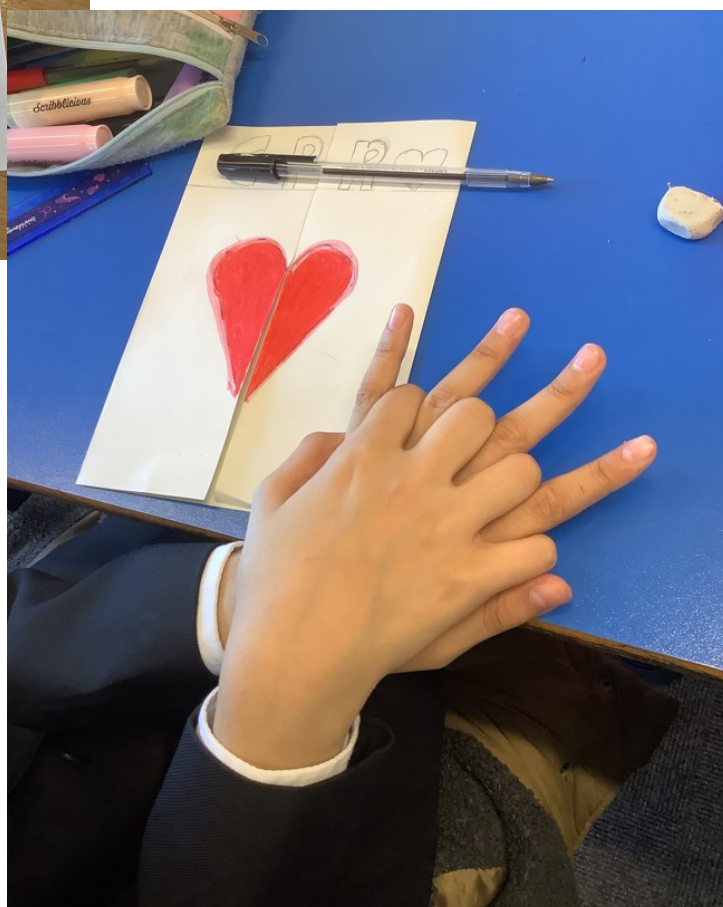
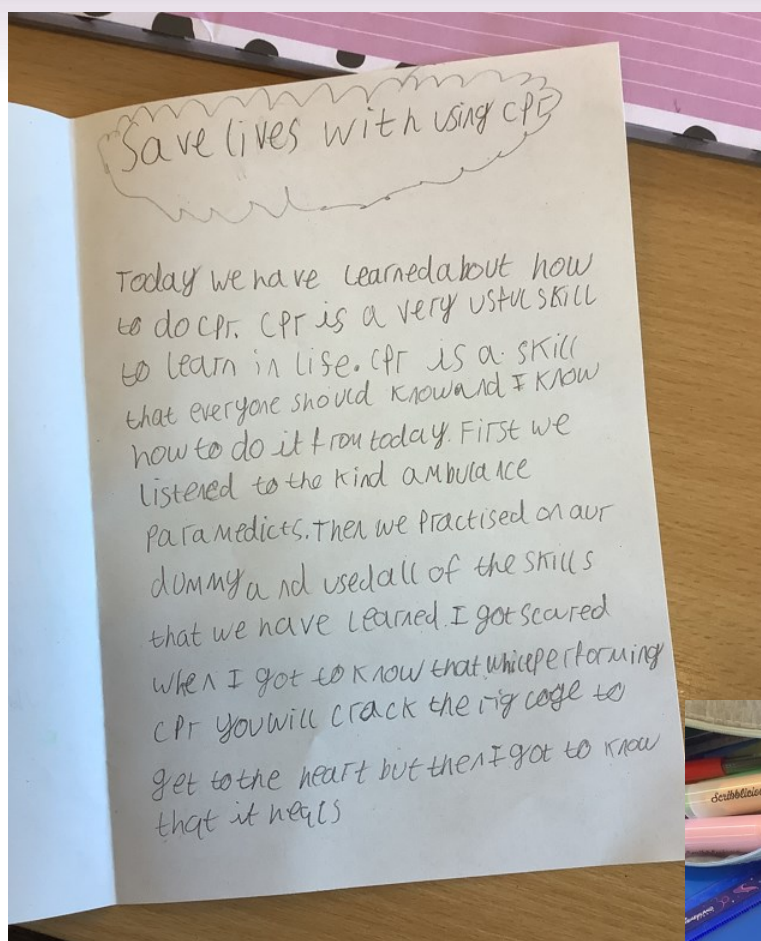
Why is it important?

Approximately 30,000 out-of-hospital cardiac arrests happen every year in the UK. Sadly, less than 1 in 10 people survive these cardiac arrests. Performing CPR can more than double the chances of survival in some cases.

We want more people to survive by making sure you know that when someone collapses and stops breathing, it's important to call 999, perform CPR and use a defibrillator if there's one available nearby. As around 80% of out-of-hospital cardiac arrests happen in the home, this gives mums, dads, sons, daughters and friends the best chance of surviving.

Solenis is an international manufacturer that produces sustainable chemical solutions to maintain clean and healthy water.

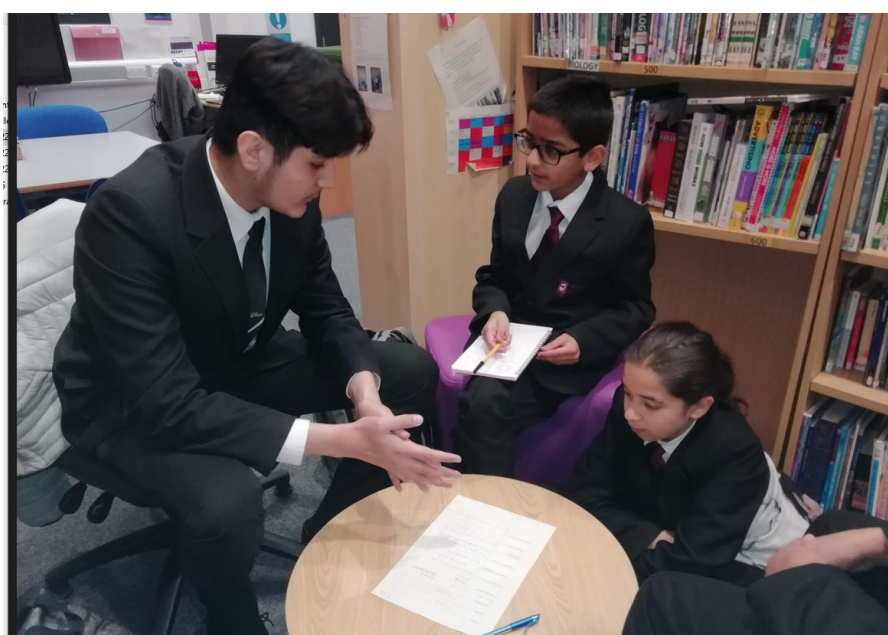


Day of Languages

Year 11 intervention for Sports Studies continues each Friday after school.

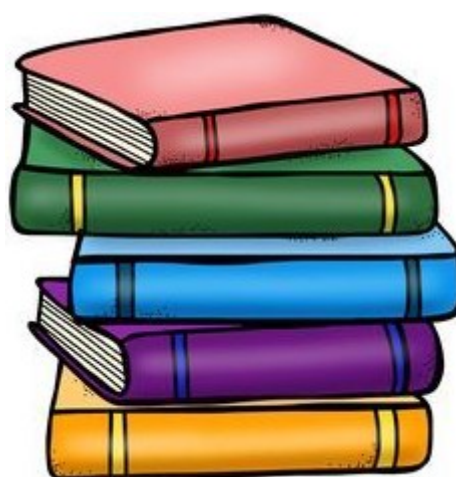

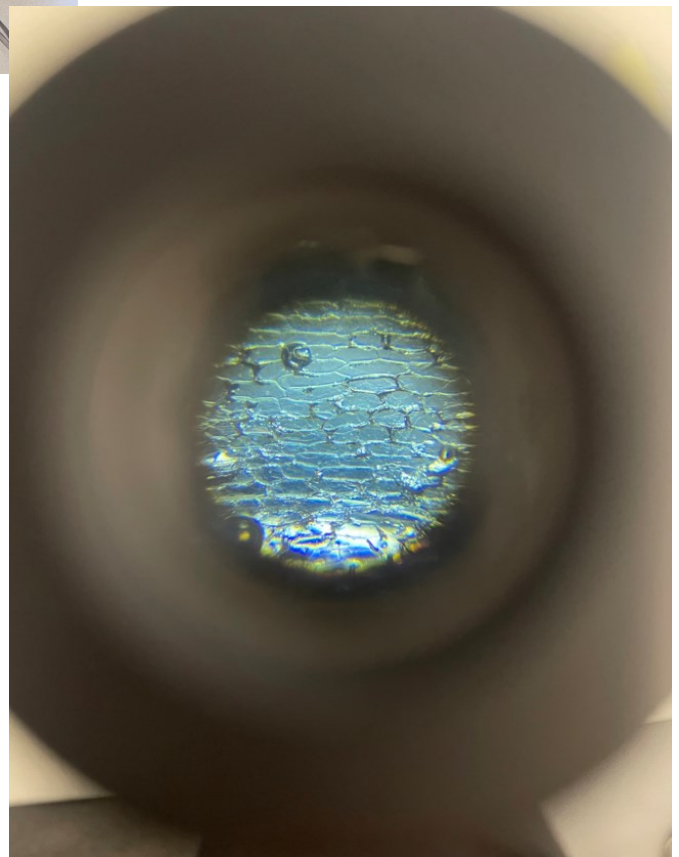
Library books can be borrowed by all students (and staff) for up to two weeks.
