

Bradford Educational Psychology Team offer free group workshops for parents and carers, via the Mental Health Champions project.

Parents and carers are eligible if they or a child/young person (up to age 18) in their care live in the **Bradford** area*.

The theme for the next round of parent workshops is:

The Emotional Brain: From Tot to Teen.

Understanding and supporting your child's emotional development from infancy to adolescence.

This workshop will help parents/carers to understand:

- The different stages of brain development from birth to adulthood, andhow this links to emotional development.
- Different types of emotions, how children and young people might experience these at different stages of development, and what behaviours we might see as a result.
- How to support children and young people to understand their emotions and be able to express these in safe ways.
