I have attached a copy here of Pages 7 to 9 of our Behaviour and Recognition protocol.

We have been asked by several parents and the media what has been the punishment for students following the events on the afternoon of Friday 26<sup>th</sup> April. We do not discuss individual students, however, there have been appropriate consequences for those whose actions were dangerous. We can confirm that we are not intending to prosecute. Our job is to educate not to prosecute. More importantly, we continue to work with our school community to heal and live our core values of kindness, excellence, and integrity.
