	5 BUH Rights: Ready Respectful Safe	Responsibility - Student	Responsibility - Parent
1	<p>To always be ready to learn in lessons, acquiring expert knowledge and without distraction from others</p>	<p>Follow the ready routine without question Ensure that I am comfortable before my lesson (students will not be allowed out of class to visit the toilet or get a drink, these things need to happen at break times as every missed minute of a lesson is lost learning time.)</p> <p>Bring my equipment to every lesson. Should I forget my equipment politely and respectfully ask my teacher to provide it.</p> <p>Do what is asked of me in my lesson so that I learn what I need to. Complete all home learning as required.</p> <p>Respect and actively support other’s right to learn. Mobile phones are not allowed in school as such I will never have it / will never have it confiscated.</p>	<p>Ensure your child is ready for school by packing their bags the night before and ensuring the right equipment.</p> <p>Repeat the messages of ready, respectful, safe and support staff in their high expectations of your child.</p>
2	<p>To be recognised and rewarded when I am doing the right thing. (Respect)</p>	<p><u>Basics – rewarded with a smile and a thank you – “caught doing the right thing”/ social praise.</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Follow the ready routine ✓ Always be on time ✓ Walk, do not run in corridors ✓ Leave mobile phones at home/ in bags until the end of the day ✓ Use the toilet at break times only. Take drinks at break times only. ✓ Coats in bags at all times unless coming into school or going outside to break. ✓ Use indoor voices indoors ✓ Speak carefully and always with kindness and respect Respond to requests first time every time because you know this is the right thing to do. ✓ Eat only in designated areas, tidy litter away <p><u>Above and Beyond – rewarded via class charts</u></p> <p>Contribution to school community</p>	<p>Conversations with your child about their day, reinforce the good things.</p> <p>Send your child to school with positivity – a smile and a “have a good day”</p>

<p>3</p>	<p>To take pride in coming to school because it's a calm safe environment and everyone is treated with respect</p>	<p>On time every day without fail.</p> <p>On time for lessons – this shows respect for others learning and the member of staff who has planned that lesson.</p> <p>Well behaved on buses and when walking to and from school – you are respectful of different environments Get involved fully in school life.</p> <p>Wear all uniform correctly and follow rules on makeup and hairstyles etc. – it is a sign that you belong and that you respect others and your school by wearing it well. Expect to be challenged if it is incorrect and provided with appropriate uniform if yours is not right.</p> <p>Chewing gum is banned in school as such students will never be caught chewing it, if they are they can expect to be sanctioned which they must accept without questioning.</p> <p>Litter should never be dropped but placed in bins.</p>	<p>Ensure your child arrives on time for school every day – respectful, ready and safe</p> <p>Support the messages of inclusion, tolerance and respect.</p> <p>Work with us to help us better understand your communities in order that we can fully integrate this understanding into our school life.</p>
<p>4</p>	<p>To learn how to regulate and mature my behaviour so that I can succeed both in school and wider society</p> <p>(Ready, respect, safe)</p>	<p>Accept when I am wrong and learn from it (C's cannot be worked off – develop resilience, respond appropriately and move on. Do not answer back/ challenge a decision, accept the sanction and move on – staff will be respectful when issuing sanctions, students will be as they take them).</p> <p>Accept that the rules keep me safe/ help me to acquire knowledge about the world and its wider rules and knowledge and understanding is my key to success.</p> <p>Know and accept that it is never acceptable to hurt – either physically or emotionally another person in the school. Always aim to be kind.</p> <p>Accept that every action has a consequence. But that these consequences can be learning moments and scaffold you to success.</p>	<p>Aim high for your children and understand that to succeed in society we need to tackle disadvantage and enable our children – supporting social, emotional and behavioural development will do this.</p> <p>Trust that the school is firm but fair and support our routines and rules.</p> <p>Social Behaviour Mapping to support parents to support students?</p>

	<p>Students who wish to speak with PDLs/CFLs need to do this when not in lessons, in emergencies these staff will seek out students, not the other way around. Students should be in lessons at all times and never “queueing” outside of offices.</p> <p>Students should not self-refer to the medical team and again should only be at the medical room when waiting to go home or having been taken there by a member of staff.</p> <p>Accept that the rules are there to support me and help the school to function well and make its main business learning and success. Working to the rules shows emotional depth and maturity.</p> <p>Make appointments with the doctor outside of school time. Make every effort to be in school – minor issues e.g., headaches, tummy aches are part of adult life and should not stop students attending school or missing lessons. School medical staff will always send students back to class unless it is an absolute emergency / sickness that cannot be treated at school.</p>	<p>Parents should not send their children to school with CV19 Symptoms and must get a PCR test on the day of the first symptom. Other minor ailments though are not excuses for taking days off school and all local e.g., GP medical appointments must be made outside of school</p>
5	<p>Walk (on the left!) Don't Run</p> <p>No physical contact with other students – everyone needs some personal space. Indoor Voices – inside our school we do not shout, and we speak at a volume that is calm and respectful. This ensures all students in our school feel safe and welcomed.</p> <p>Ball games are played only in designated spaces and should not prevent other students from having a calm breaktime</p> <p>We do not swear or use language that is considered rude, derogatory, unkind or inflammatory. If we do, we can expect to be sanctioned for it.</p> <p>Smile and hold doors open/ allow others to move freely / support them if required</p>	<p>Respect the rules of engagement with school, make appointments to see us, (48 hrs); be respectful and polite when you come into school, ask us if you have any concerns.</p> <p>All parents must sign the home school agreement to signify engagement with the above.</p>
