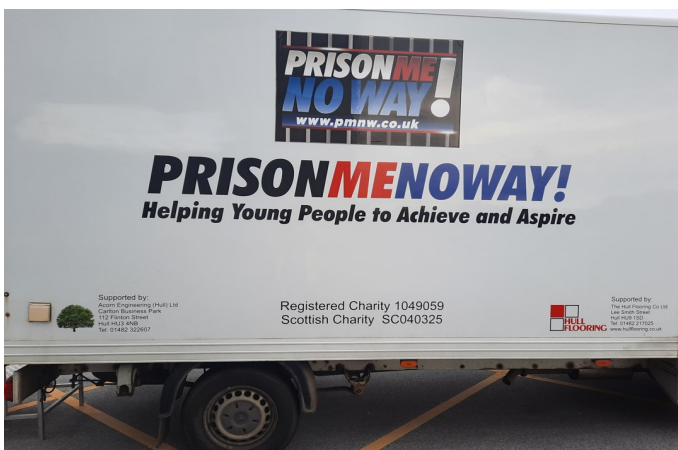
WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING IN SCHOOL?

Parent Pay

We have created you a secure online account, activated using a unique activation username and password and this has been sent to you by email. You will be prompted to change these and to keep them safe and secure as your Username and Password for future logins. Please visit www.parentpay.com and activate your account via the **Account login** area on the home page of the site.

ParentPay holds an electronic record of your payments to view at a later date. Once you have activated your account you can make online payments straight away.

Biometric consent (thumbprint scanning)

Beckfoot Upper Heaton runs a cashless catering system for the purpose of purchasing food and drink from the school canteen. This biometric system incorporates the latest technology and eliminates the need for pupils to carry cash or cards as the system will recognise the thumb print of your child at the revaluation pay points and at the tills. If we have your signed biometric consent form, your child will have their thumb print scanned and can pay for their snacks and lunch quickly and securely. You can check if you qualify for free school meals by following this link:

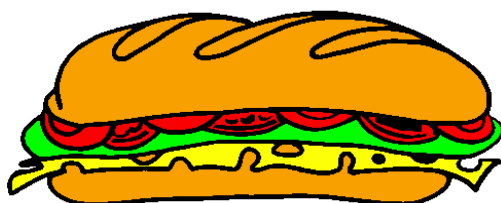

Once you have applied for free school meals and you qualify, your child/ward will be automatically added to the school's Free School Meal list, please do this in good time, as we will not be able to provide a free school meal until your child/ward has been added to the school's council list.

How would your child access the free school meal?

The Free School Meal allowance is downloaded automatically onto your child's catering account and payment for food is made in exactly the same way as all other students. It is completely confidential; no-one can tell if a student is having a Free School Meal.
