She speaks openly about her past and the struggles she had to endure. Growing up in a dysfunctional environment. Sharena left school education at a very young age due to her home life, she was left caring for her Mother and younger siblings which cost her, her own education. She battled through her childhood when all the odds were against her. 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
J.B. PRIESTLEY WINDOWS



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OUR LIBRARY

Beckfoot Upper Heaton library is now fully open to students. Year 11s can use it any break, lunchtime or period 6, the other year groups can come two break times and two lunchtimes a week according to the timetable. Book Clubs for Yr 7s run on Tuesday lunchtimes and for Yr 8s on Monday lunchtimes. There is also a Games Club planned for Friday lunchtimes.

Staff can book out laptops and an additional classroom space at the far end of the library for research or revision lessons.

YEAR 11 SUPERVISED REVISION

To support all our Year 11 students in their preparation for examinations, the library will be available to students for supervised revision after school until 3.30pm every day. Those students who have been identified to attend a period 6 intervention must attend their session but can make use of the library on other days.

The library will be staffed by colleagues who can offer students support with their revision. The facilities in the library will include subject specific books and revision guides, the use of laptops, a quiet study area and spare equipment can be purchased. We are creating a space conducive to revision so working in silence and a high standard of behaviour will be expected of all students.

We are now working closely with a team of specialists from the Local Authority, Bradford Council, to improve students' attendance and punctuality. Students may see these colleagues around school from now on offering support to families.


The best place for children to be is in school, and every effort should be made by parents and carers to ensure that they attend **every day and on time.** Whilst we appreciate that sometimes children do get ill, not all illnesses are serious enough to warrant missing school and a day of their education. Some minor illnesses, therefore, **will not be authorised from now on**. If your child has a headache or stomachache, please remember that lots of fluids and a paracetamol may help them to feel better and then able to attend school. Children often start to feel better once they're up and about. We also have a Healthcare Assistant in school to whom students can go if they feel ill whilst at school for some support.

Whilst students are still required to isolate for 5 days after a positive Covid-19 result, they should access schoolwork and contact teachers via ClassCharts. Please remember to contact school immediately if your child tests positive for COVID-19.
