

We will be sharing the new rules with students next week as well as our exciting new rewards policy.

Your children may have told you about our plans to overhaul sanctions and have a real focus on attendance.

We know that some families struggle when their children are given detentions after school as it can affect childcare, lifts home and working hours. We have, therefore, taken the decision to move detentions to break and lunch times. We hope that this will, not only support our community, but will also allow us to invest time in restorative conversations with students in school hours.

#### Parents and carers - we need your help to improve attendance and punctuality!

COVID-19 has affected our students' attendance, but now it's time for every student to be **in school, on time, every single day.** We are determined to improve our students' attendance and have begun to work in partnership with the Local Authority to re-engage students and escalate our sanctions for lateness to school.

We at Beckfoot Upper Heaton, want your children to get every single minute of learning. When they are late to school or lessons they miss out. Please support us to make sure your child gets a full education by ensuring they are in school by 8.20 and that you challenge them if we record their lateness on Class Charts. ## **ATTENDANCE**

We are now working closely with a team of specialists from the Local Authority, Bradford Council, to improve students' attendance and punctuality. Students may see these colleagues around school from now on offering support to families.

The best place for children to be is in school, and every effort should be made by parents and carers to ensure that they attend every day and on time. Whilst we appreciate that sometimes children do get ill, not all illnesses are serious enough to warrant missing school and a day of their education. Some minor illnesses, therefore, will not be authorised from now on. If your child has a headache or stomachache, please remember that lots of fluids and a paracetamol may help them to feel better and then able to attend school. Children often start to feel better once they're up and about. We also have a Healthcare Assistant in school to whom students can go if they feel ill whilst at school for some support.

Whilst students are still required to isolate for 5 days after a positive Covid-19 result, they should access schoolwork and contact teachers via ClassCharts. Please remember to contact school immediately if your child tests positive for COVID-19.

Please continue to contact the school daily when your child is absent on 01274 493 533 or via the MyEd app.

Soon we will be introducing sanctions for any students who arrive late. As a reminder, please see the start of the day timings below:



## **BRADFORD NIGHTSTOP** Challenging Youth Homelessness

#### How do you contact Bradford Night stop for help?

Street link is a national organisation that helps members of the public to connect people sleeping rough with services that can help. Contact Street link or you can phone them on 0300 500 0914 Street link will forward the details to Bradford No Second Night Out who will then make contact with the rough sleeper.

#### **Key facts**

**Bradford Night stop provides emergency** accommodation for homeless young people (16-25) in the homes of vetted and trained volunteers. One night at a time, the young person is offered a place of safety with a room of their own, transport, meals, essential supplies, washing facilities and support for their next step

#### **Key facts**

Racial minorities in **Bradford** are more than three times as likely to become homeless as white people, due to "deep inequality and systemic racism" in the housing system.



#### What can you do to help?

Bradford Nightstop is always in need of volunteers, people to take the phone calls, drive the young people to their accommodation or even becoming a host. Also, they are always in need of dominations of: Jogging bottoms / jumpers, Male/female socks (unbranded), T-shirts, Toiletries and Toothbrushes (unused).

## **SCHOOL NEWS SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY, ENGINEERING &**



## **MATHS SUPPORT**



We are delighted to announce that we will be using Sparx Maths (www.sparxmaths.uk) as our new homework platform for KS3 and KS4 mathematics homework for the remainder of this academic year.

Sparx is similar to our current platform, Hegarty Maths but provides students with more personalised practice to improve and challenge their mathematical thinking depending on their current level. Each homework will consist of current knowledge and skills being studied in class as well as revisiting previous learning.

Students will be introduced to Sparx in their maths lessons this week and shown how to log in and use the platform. Each student will need a Sparx Maths homework book in which their homework should be completed. It is vital that students show their written work for their homework.

Students will be expected to complete one hour of compulsory maths homework each week. There is also the opportunity to complete additional homework called 'XP boost' and 'Target'. There is also the option for students to access independent learning where they can access work on any topic they choose whenever they wish.


Students are rewarded with XP for effort regardless of the level they are working at. We will be closely monitoring the Sparx Maths leader board and providing rewards for students who show outstanding effort and achievement.




## Work For Isolating Students

We know it can be worrying if your child is at home isolating.

To help them stay in touch with their learning teachers are setting work on ClassCharts. If you or your child does not have their access code their PDL can provide it.

Once a student is logged on, they can click on Homework in the left-hand menu.






Now you can see a screen like this.

Clicking on the down arrow will expand the list

A list of tasks will appear, it may not be set by your child's class teacher, but it is work for them to complete.

Clicking on the pop out button will show the task in detail





This pop-up screen will explain the task and have any links to external websites needed.

Clicking on the completed button will move the task from To Do to Completed.

If your child needs help with the tasks they should contact their teacher, either through the school email system or the Messages system on ClassCharts.
