Visit from Leeds Beckett University student ambassadors

Last Friday 20 students from Year 9 and 30 from Year 10 attended a talk given by two undergraduate students from Leeds Beckett University; Nicole who is studying Fine Art and Angad who is studying Law. They spoke about what university is like, from a typical weekly schedule and the type of accommodation on offer, to the different clubs and societies available and how much it all costs.

Students were amazed to discover there are over 400 higher education establishments in the UK where you can study for a degree and over 50,000 degree courses! Leeds Beckett alone offers over 300 courses and specialises in Sports Studies. It has the most modern university sports campus in Europe and sports teams that compete all over the country.

Miss Pye and Mrs Mathewson also spoke about their own university experiences. Miss Pye went to Liverpool University where she studied English before doing a Masters in Law. Mrs Mathewson went to Warwick University and studied French & European Literature and had a year in France as part of her degree.
