Year 10 Art & Year 9 Creative Pathway Students trip to Leeds Art University Wednesday 13th July

GCSE year 10 students and year 9 students participating in the Creative Pathways Programme have been invited to visit Leeds Art University. Students will be shown around the campus and attend a presentation on creative careers, routes and options for the future. They will then participate in a 55-minute workshop led by a University Lecturer which will directly link to their coursework.



Year 7 & 8 STEM Event Thursday 14th & Friday, 15th July

Year 8 & year 7 students will be taking part in a STEM (science, technology, engineering & maths) day on Thursday 14th & Friday 15th July; they will be looking at the UK built ExoMars Rosalind Franklin rover - named after the famous scientist who discovered the structure of DNA, one of the fundamental building blocks of life. Her discovery helped us understand life on Earth and now the rover named after her will be searching for signs of life on Mars!

Using support from the UK Space Agency students will design build and test their own prototype Mars rover. The UK Space Agency is collaborating with several space agencies around the world on joint exploration missions to the International Space Station, the Moon and to Mars. Here in the UK, scientists and space industry are contributing to these missions in lots of ways, including building some of the rovers, probes and the scientific instruments they carry.
