The students were taken on a tour of the University and given a fantastic insight into the opportunities for further education in all areas of the Arts such as Graphic Design, Film & Photography and Music.
















WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING THIS WEEK? Year 7 & 8 STEM Days

Year 10 Relationship & Sex Education—Monday

On Monday as part of our PSHCE curriculum, Year 10 pupils will be participating in five sessions around relationships and sex. These will be delivered by our in-school RSE team, and professionals from HALE and James Project.

Year 10 Futures Day—Tuesday

On Tuesday, Year 10 will take part in Futures day, where they will learn skills for their adulthood, such as interview techniques with the DWP. They will have a visit from Jess Fowle, who is one of the founders and Creative Directors of True North – one of the biggest non-scripted TV companies in the UK, a session on Social media use which can affect their future employability, and also the benefits of working as a successful team.

The great library book scanning challenge

The library has finally caught up with the 21st century! We now have a computerised catalogue of books which means it is possible to search for any book we have in the library by title, author, genre or key word. We can also keep track of which books have been borrowed much more easily.

BUT, for it to work, all the books need to be bar-coded and scanned into the system. My library assistants and I have been working hard over the last few weeks to do this and have so far managed to scan in 2,500. However, there are still another 4,000 to go!

So, we have set ourselves the challenge of getting all the main fiction and nonfiction books onto the system before the end of term. On Wednesday, 20th July, we will be running a non-stop scanning day and hope to add 1000 books between us. That means 100 books per library assistant. Do you think we can do it?

PROGRESSION ONLINE SUMMER ART SCHOOL for all ages

Creative production skills for Anansi Spider Stories (Creative Development, Drawing, Character creation, Storyboards) An online creative workshop from Monday August 1st and will be available until September 1st 2022.



This online summer school in creative development, drawing skills, character creation and storyboards is for participants who would love to be creative this summer, but may not be able to attend to the in-person summer school.

The theme is part of a research project, which is led by Leeds Arts University Senior Lecturer in Animation Ben Simpson (aka Dr Simpo) and Film and Photography Instructor Eddie Lockhart.

Participants are invited to make creative contributions, to be incorporated into a collaborative 'Anansi Spider Stories' animation. It is intended that the final work will be celebrated and presented in Leeds and beyond in 2023.

Anansi the Spider is an African folktale character who is associated with skill and wisdom. However, there is a mischievous side to Anansi, who often outwits foes much larger than themselves.



The Progression Online Summer School 2022 is a free course, designed to provide participants opportunities to develop creative works towards an animation that will be compiled and edited by Ben Simpson and Eddie Lockhart.

In this online short course students will work through a series of approaches, led by an inspiring tutor, who through video demonstrations and downloadable handouts will help develop creative thinking and making skills, such as idea development, experimental drawing, character development and storyboards.

Participants will be able to email examples of their work for feedback from the Progression team throughout the week of August 1st to 5th and up to September 1st.

The Progression Summer Art School is a widening participation initiative that is part of Leeds Arts University's Access and Participation Plan, approved by the Office for Students (OfS). The course is very popular and numbers are limited, therefore applications are considered on an individual basis. Young people from under-represented backgrounds or who live in an area of low participation in higher education will be prioritised.
