As you are aware, since January I have been supporting the staff and students at Beckfoot Upper Heaton and I have been assisted in this by members of our central team, in particular Mrs Senior, Director of Professional Growth. As I write this, we are in the middle of our recruitment process for a Headteacher, and I will be able to update you on this after the half term holiday. Beckfoot Upper Heaton is proud to have been selected as part of The Arts in Schools programme. Ms Bone and Mr Saddique collaborated closely with a games design company to deliver an after school digital art club teaching students how to make a games programme. The collaboration was so successful that our school has been identified by A New Direction, a National online platform, as an example of best arts practice across the UK.

To celebrate the 40th anniversary of the Calouste Gulbenkian Foundation's report The Arts in Schools, A New Direction has commissioned a suite of case studies designed to be a practical resource with inspiring examples that explore the value of the arts in education. Each case study has taken a how-to approach, to support you to develop ideas.

They cover a wide variety of perspectives on the value of the arts in schools, grouped into the following seven themes:

- Wide range of artforms: how can we ensure children experience the rich benefits of all art forms?
- Curriculum need: how can we build a project that supports identified needs in the curriculum?




