Our students have settled back into school eager to do well, foster new friendships and enjoy new learning. Currently, our overall student attendance is over 4% higher compared to this time last year. This is because our students enjoy school and are happy receiving high quality teaching from their specialist teachers. Whilst we can see improvements in student attendance, this remains our number one priority. If students are not in the building, they cannot learn or achieve their potential. Please encourage your child to attend school every day and build their resilience for employment.

When I began my Headship back in June 2023, parents raised concerns regarding the high level of supply staff at school. There were several reasons for this. Families will be aware from media the shortage in teaching staff in some subject areas. This is a national issue. To mitigate against this, we have put in place 'merged' teaching of two or three classes, whereby students are taught by a subject specialist and supported by a member of the senior leadership or pastoral team. This has worked well, and we will continue to implement this strategy rather than to use daily supply staff. We have also made changes to student timetables from January 2024. This is to ensure that we can provide the best quality teaching with subject specialists. We believe our young people should get the best possible teaching, because a good quality education can change lives. We are 100% committed in putting students first.

We have had several external visits this term from Ms Shirley Watson (CEO) and her team. There was a further visit by our Chair of the Local School Committee, Mrs Naz Akhtar and Mrs Karen Boyd. They reviewed our school systems, behaviour, and teaching and learning. We have received a very positive report.

Our Trust Concert was an immense success! Along with the rest of our Trust schools, our students did us proud. They demonstrated excellence in teamwork and showcased musical talents. We are holding a mini-concert in school on Thursday 14th December at 3.30pm - 4.00pm. It is free! Please do try to attend and support the students and your school.

We are working hard to ensure students of all year groups receive meaningful homework every day. You can find the homework schedule on our website. As always, we are happy to receive feedback from parents. Mr Ward, Deputy Headteacher for Quality of Education, will be monitoring this important aspect of student work.

We have run various school trips, including Year 7 trips to Nell Bank Outdoor Activity Centre. In January, we will be taking some students to the University of Cambridge. Colleagues from this prestigious Russell Group university will also be working with students from Key Stage 3 and 4 at Beckfoot Upper Heaton. Your support for our school sentence where we all belong, our three values of excellence, integrity and kindness, and to anchor all that we do with our five simple habits:



STUDENT LOCKERS FOR YEAR 11

We are always looking at ways to effectively utilise the spaces in school. This is difficult to manage and becomes more of an issue during exam periods as we look for ways to best support all our students and in particular, those who have additional exam access arrangements (EAA).

The January/February mocks are only weeks away, scheduled for the weeks commencing **29**th **January to Friday 02**nd **February 2024**. We would like to offer students the opportunity of having a locker in school for use for the remainder of year 11 and throughout the exam season. These can be used to store coats and bags (during exams) and will help to free up other spaces currently being used.

We will provide students with a locker, padlock and 1 key. The spare key will be kept in school for use if required. There will be chargeable (deposit) of £5 per locker payable via Parent Pay. This will become available from **Monday, 11**th **December** and lockers will be allocated on return in the new year. ParentPay

This deposit will be returned at the end of the summer exam series, subject to the following conditions being met:

- No damage to the locker on inspection
- Key and padlock returned to school




NEXT GEN LEADERS






EXCELLENT WORK IN SCIENCE








Lost Property


