As you know, raising attendance has been one of our whole-school priorities this year, and will continue to be. As part of our strategy for encouraging students to attend school every day, as a reward, 125 students will be attending the Flamingo Land trip on Monday 21st July.

Trip to Paris

We are very excited to share the brilliant news that we are planning BUH's first international trip ever – to Paris!

The trip will take place from 6th to 9th July 2026 and will include a day sightseeing in Paris and a day at Disneyland. The price per student is £585 based on 40 students taking part. Please note that the price may change should we not fill all 40 places. **Tickets now on sale on ParentPay—£100 deposit secures your place.**

The school is committed to make this opportunity affordable for everyone. Therefore, the following has been agreed:

- For students who are eligible for free school meals, the full price will be reduced by 20%
- For any looked after children, the full price will be reduced by 50%.

This trip will be a valuable experience for our students. It will help them to learn about a new culture, make new friends, and gain independence. We encourage you to consider allowing your child to participate.

Mobile Phones

We want students to be able to learn without the distraction caused by mobile phones and other electronic devices. The evidence tells us that mobile phones are a significant distraction to young people as both the device and the apps are designed to be addictive. They also undermine confidence and relationship building.

Many young people would rather communicate via a device than in person, which can lead to un-healthy relationships with their peers. Mobile phones have an impact on student's mental health for many reasons including: increased anxiety, increased distraction, self-image issues, cyberbullying, impacts on sleep patterns and loss of confidence.

Therefore, to support the development of our students:

- Mobile phones, smart watches, and all other electronic devices must not be visible once on school grounds.
- Mobile phones should be turned off, out of sight and inside the student's bag or pocket.
- Mobile phones seen will be confiscated and placed in the school office. Students will receive a C3 code and a 30-minute after school correction. However, if a student refuses to hand over their mobile phone, they will be taken to R&R for a minimum of 2 lessons plus 1 social time. Another chance will then be given to hand over their mobile phone.
- 1st time confiscated – end of day plus 30-minute correction
- Multiple confiscations – item must be collected by a parent/guardian plus 30-minute correction





Changes to dinner money payment from September 2025

We are writing to inform you about an important change regarding our school's catering services.

This change is being implemented to streamline payment processes, reduce risks associated with cash and enhance the security and efficiency of our systems.

Effective from 31st August 2025, all catering cash payment machines in school will be removed. Students will no longer be able to pay for their meals by cash in school and we will become a cashless site.

Moving forward, all payments for school meals will need to be made through the ParentPay system, which allows for secure, cashless transactions and provides a convenient way for parents to manage their child's meal payments online.

Key points to note:

- **Date of Change:** 31st August 2025
- **New Payment Method:** ParentPay (no cash payments will be accepted)
- **Benefits:** Reduced cash risk, convenience, and efficiency

We understand that this change may require some adjustment, and we are here to support you through this transition.

If you have not yet registered for ParentPay, please do so at your earliest convenience by contacting Mr Yu, Office Manager, who will provide you with a registration code and instructions.

Guidance from the Prevent Team

As the summer holidays approach and children begin to spend more time at home, many will naturally turn to the online world for entertainment, learning, and social interaction. While the internet offers a wealth of opportunities, it also presents certain risks—particularly for young and impressionable minds.

Within Bradford Local Authority, the Prevent team works closely with schools and the wider community to support understanding and implementation of the Prevent Duty. Today, we are reaching out to raise awareness not only about the online risks associated with the Prevent agenda, but also to highlight broader concerns around online safety.

More young people than ever are engaging with digital platforms, and while these spaces can be both fun and educational, they can also expose children to harmful content or individuals. Just as we teach children about “stranger danger” in the real world, it is equally important to equip them with the knowledge and tools to stay safe online.

Key Online Safety Tips for Parents and Carers:

Talk regularly with your child about their online activity. Encourage open conversations about what they’re doing, who they’re talking to, and how they feel about their experiences.

Set clear boundaries around screen time and the types of websites or apps they can use.

Use parental controls on devices, apps, and your home internet to help filter inappropriate content and monitor usage.

Encourage critical thinking—help your child understand that not everything they see or read online is true or safe.

Be alert to signs of distress or secrecy around online activity, which could indicate exposure to harmful content or online grooming.

Stay informed about the latest apps, games, and trends that children are using, as these can change rapidly.

We encourage you to take a moment to explore the resources available on our dedicated webpage. These materials offer practical guidance and support to help you keep your children safe while they navigate the digital world.

Please take advantage of the half term to ensure your child has full 100% correct school uniform in time for the start of the new term.

Item	Uniform Expectation	Example of what is <u>NOT</u> allowed
Trousers	Boys and Girls – black school trousers 	This DOES NOT include any of the following: black denim trousers, black jogging bottoms, trousers made of any stretchy material, leggings, skinny style trousers, trousers made of any fabric other than standard school trouser fabric. 
Shirts	White shirt with top button and collar. Top button must be fastened, and shirt must be tucked in all the way round.	No t-shirts or football shirts under the school shirt.
Blazer	The school blazer must be worn at all times.	Cardigans, hoodies, jumpers must not be worn in school.
